## Position Purpose

AAM Investment Group (AAM) is an Australian owned and operated provider of investment, asset management, operational and consultancy services. Legune Station is located on 306,000 hectares of private land in the Joseph Bonaparte Gulf, bordering Western Australia and the picturesque Kimberley region. Legune Station runs 35,000 head of high-grade Brahman cattle, with approximately 20 staff located at the station. The region boasts some of the best fishing in Australia and provides easy access to top attractions such as Lake Argyle, the Bungle Bungles and El Questro Homestead just to name a few!

Reporting to the Station Manager, the Bore Runner through liaising with the Station Manager ensures water supply to all livestock and station homestead.

## Key Responsibilities

- Liaise with management on a daily basis to inform of any problems with water supplies.
- Maintain water supply to livestock and homestead.
- Liaise with Head Stockman on mustering program to ensure tank/turkey nest is full the day before cattle are in yards.
- Keep troughs in good order i.e. fix leaks, clean etc
- Report and record any livestock deaths noted on bore runs.
- Remove bogged or stuck cattle out of watering points if required and log deaths.
- Fill and maintain back rubbers for cattle.
- Keep an inventory on bore equipment and spares and ensure that new equipment is recorded to where it is used.
- Ensure sufficient bore and water supplies are kept on hand and liaise with manager on requirements prior to running out.
- Keep vehicle, tools and equipment in good working order through regular maintenance and cleaning.
- Keep a daily bore diary and provide weekly check sheets on water supplies.
- Prepare monthly bore report for the manager due on the last Friday of each month.
- Repair any fences required while on bore run.
- All turkey nest or water storage needs to be 3/4 full or above throughout the season where pumping is available.
- All watering points are to be checked on a rotational basis every second day and repair any broken/worn waterlines.
- Service and maintain bore pumps and pull bores as required.
- Check piezometers monthly and maintain a tidy and orderly bore shed.
- May be required to assist in other areas of the station activities as directed by the manager.
- Ensure compliance with Company Policies and Procedures within the scope of the position including ensuring approval for all orders before placing requests.

- AAM is committed to providing a safe and healthy workplace for all staff, clients, and visitors to our facilities. All staff are required to contribute to and promote a continuous workplace health and safety culture.

### Experience and Qualifications

- Experience in maintaining water supplies on a remote work site.
- Must have been or be prepared to be vaccinated against tetanus, hepatitis and Q fever.
- Current Driver's Licence.
- Machinery operator licences as required.
